SUMMER VISIT 2010

The Summer Visit for 2010 will be to **Dulwich College Library, Dulwich Common, London SE21 7LD, on Tuesday, 15 June, beginning at 2.15**. Robert Weaver will introduce the Fellows' Library, containing the College's rare books, and Dr Calista Lucy, archivist, will introduce the Henslowe-Alleyn papers. An exhibition of highlights of the collection will be displayed for the Society, and tea will be served at the end of the visit.

The Fellows' Library evolved over three centuries and ranges from medieval Latin and middle English manuscripts, to incunabula (one unique Pynson imprint), and early books on science, maths, classics, travel and English literature. The Henslowe and Alleyn papers are the most important single archive on the professional theatre of the Elizabethan and Jacobean era; their digitisation project received assistance from the Bibliographical Society.

The visit is open to all members of the Society, without charge, but numbers are limited and those intending to come must notify the Hon. Secretary by post or e-mail not later than 10 June. Guests may be permitted if numbers allow, but preference will be given to members; places will be allocated as replies are received and confirmation will be sent.

Trains run regularly from Victoria Station, London, to West Dulwich (a 12-minute journey); the College is a 5-minute walk from the station.
